I hope everyone has a great summer,



Scotland Facts

The population of Scotland was 5.1 million in 1995. Glasgow is the largest city with 619,000, Edinburgh, the capital, has 448,000 and Aberdeen has about 219,000.

Scotland has approximately 600 golf courses. There are just over 100 whisky distilleries there.

Scotland covers an area of 48,955 sq. miles and is situated between 55 and 60 degrees north. Shetland is closer to the Arctic Circle than to the south of England. Scotland comprises 34% of Britain's land mass and is roughly two-thirds the size of England.

The rocks in Scotland are amongst the oldest in the world, about 3 billion years old. Scotland was at one time part of a huge continent linking North America and Scandinavia. Scotland was separated from England by a sea 1,000 miles wide. Scotland was once south of the equator and baked in sub-tropical temperatures.
