The Heather and Thistle Society meets 10 times a year, September through June. Programs include music, singing, dancing, lively lectures, slide shows and movies about Scotland. The Heather and Thistle Society puts on the annual Robert Burn's Supper and Ball in late January of each year. We are an organization that promotes our Scottish heritage, in various ways.
