Feb. 7, 1823 – George Washington Wilson, Scottish artist and pioneer photographer, born.

Feb. 8, 1587 – Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots, executed by the English.

Feb. 9, 1292 – First Scottish Parliament assembles at Scone.

Feb. 10, 1306 – Robert the Bruce slays John "the Red" Comyn at Greyfriars Kirk, Dumfries, Scotland.

Feb. 11, 1847 – Macvey Napier, a Scottish author of the Encyclopedia Britannica, died.

Feb. 13, 1692 – Massacre of Glencoe, Scotland.

Feb. 20, 1436 – James I of Scotland assassinated.

Feb. 20, 1847 – The Great Hunger in Scotland: at Wick, Caithness, a starving crowd tried to prevent departure of grain ship but were held back by soldiers.

Feb. 23, 1874 – Hugh Stevenson Robertson, Scottish composer of Songs of the Isles, born.

Feb. 24, 1303 – English invasion of Scotland annihilated at the Battle of Roslin.

Feb. 27, 1545 – Douglases defeat English at Ancrum Moor.

Feb. 28, 1912 – Scottish Home Rule Bill, patterned on Irish bill, introduced in English Parliament.
